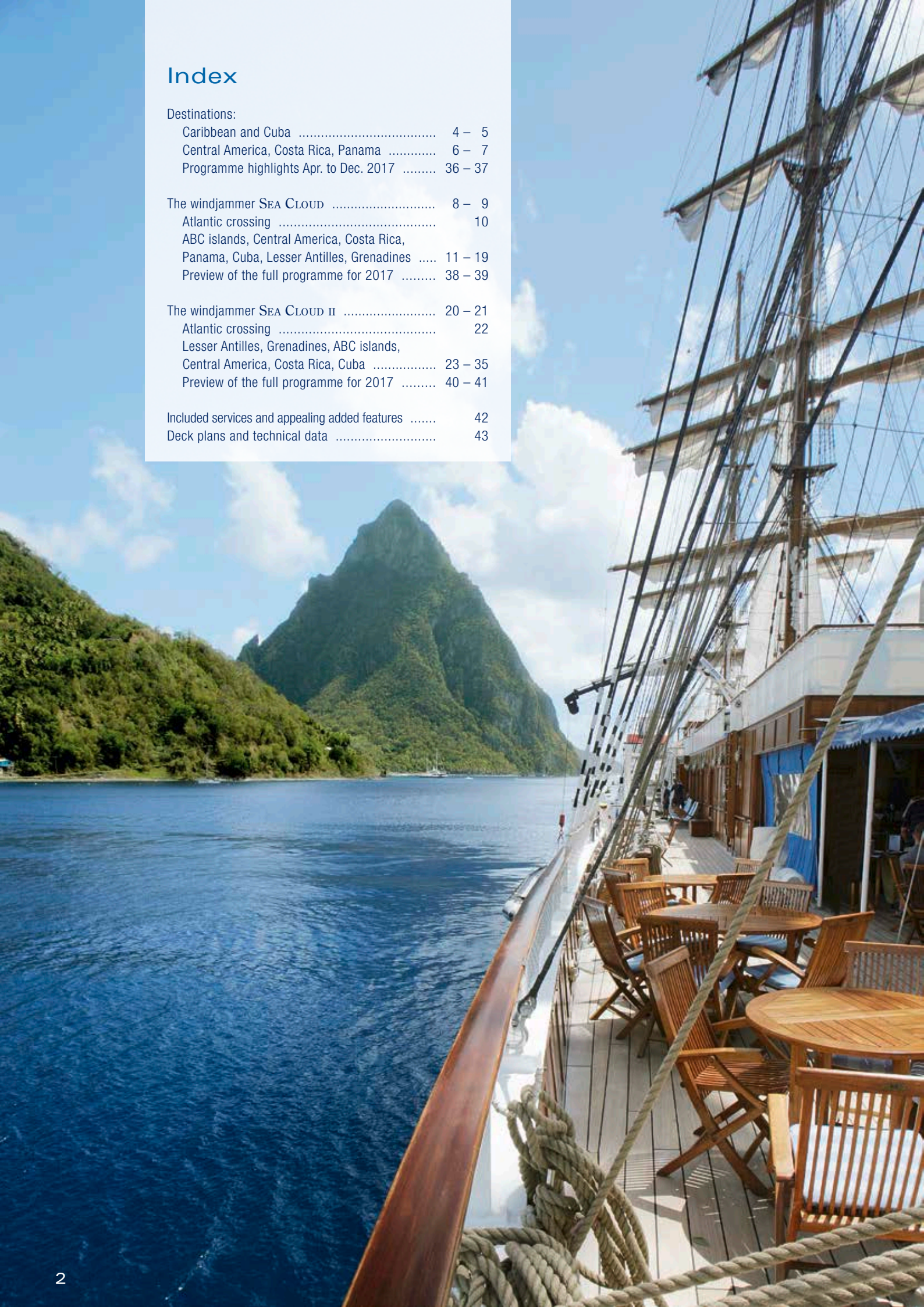

Our crew of around 60 are there to ensure that all of our guests on board (a maximum of 94 travellers from all over the world) enjoy a unique cruise experience that is tailored to their needs. Many of our crew have been working together for

years, forming an established team which meets guests' needs with a smile and spoils them with culinary delights.

CARIBBEAN AND CUBA

The Lesser Antilles run through the turquoise Caribbean Sea like a shimmering string of pearls. The waters between the British Virgin Islands in the north and the Grenadines in the south provide the perfect sailing conditions for windjammers as well as intriguing insights into a highly diverse range of cultures and lifestyles. Want to go on an excursion through tropical green forest to the volcanic sulphur springs? Why not enjoy an exquisite sundowner while watching elegant luxury yachts or perhaps go bare-footed into the beach bar? Fortunately there is no need to choose any particular highlight because every day will surprise you with a new and enjoyable feature.

Cuba really is the heart of the Caribbean. Still cut off from the capitalist West, this is a country which has kept itself free of American fast food chains and flamboyant advertising

and which always knows how to make a virtue out of necessity. Life here is all about being resourceful: In Havana's UNESCO-protected old town you will see colourful vintage cars, and people who cannot afford entry into an expensive club simply dance on the Malecón seafront promenade to the lively rhythms of street music.

That is because the three ABC islands of Aruba, Bonaire and Curaçao playfully engage with their colonial past, and with their blend of European tradition and Caribbean living, they serve up a colourful cocktail that is sure to put a smile on your face.

Nature lovers will encounter a vibrant, tropical paradise brimming with natural wonders in Panama’s and Costa Rica’s unique national parks. In the treetops of the evergreen rainforests, mangrove swamps and warm, crystal-clear waters, an abundance of fascinating animal species await. Follow this intensive natural encounter with a taste of urban life in trendy Panama City located close to the Panama Canal. Now over 100 years old, this construc-

tion is still considered one of the greatest feats in human engineering. The same is also often said of the mystical Maya temple structures found in Mexico and Belize. These mysterious places of worship, with their impressive stepped pyramids and artistic stone relief carvings, have lost none of their magical appeal over the past several millennia.

In winter and spring the Caribbean trade winds provide ideal speeds and perfect stability while delivering extremely pleasant air and water temperatures. The many hours out at sea will turn into a real joy for the tall ship, and a delight for those looking to enjoy freedom beneath the sails. All this in stunning waters.

Visit two of the ABC islands: Aruba and Curaçao

Aruba and Curaçao make up the A and C of the ABC islands and belong to the Kingdom of the Netherlands. Their distinctive features – including Delft tiles, Dutch gable houses, palms and the pastel colours of the Caribbean – make this an enchanting destination. Curaçao boasts a UNESCO World Heritage Site in the shape of its small capital Willemstad.

Panama City and the Panama Canal

When the Panama Canal opened in 1914 after more than 30 years of construction, this shortened the route for ships sailing between New York and Los Angeles by almost 15,000 kilometres (9,320 miles). Panama City has experienced enormous growth ever since. The contrast between its ultra-modern banking centre and lovingly restored historic quarters is what makes this city Central America's style capital.

Several relaxing days at sea

Besides crossing worlds, discovering new lands, and enjoying both the excitement of the shore and relaxing hours at sea, for five whole days we let rest and relaxation take a front seat on our yacht. Plenty of time to enjoy life under the white sails and for pure indulgence.

The world’s second largest coral reef

The Belize Barrier Reef is a 256-kilometre-long (159 miles) reef system which contains countless small coral islands. The Lighthouse Reef Atoll features a particularly special natural wonder: the Great Blue Hole. This circular sub-marine sinkhole, with a diameter of over 300 metres (0.19 miles), was formed during the last ice age and is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Donning your snorkel and getting an underwater view is obviously another great way to discover the impressive beauty of the reef.

Maya cities in Mexico and Belize

The sophisticated culture of the Maya in Central America, which began roughly 5,000 years ago and ended around the time of the Spanish conquest, is still a mystery. Their ceremonies seem to have been gory, their step pyramids imposing, and their stone carvings

required a great deal of skill. On our trip you will discover three mystical Maya strongholds: Tulum in Mexico is the only Maya city situated on the coast; Altun Ha and Lamanai are in Belize. Lamanai is situated on the banks of an inland lagoon and remained populated for roughly 3,000 years. Excavations have revealed that over 20,000 people lived there around 700 AD.

Trinidad’s old town

Trinidad de Cuba is a small, friendly place with a long history as a centre for sugar cane farming. Experience its charming coastal setting, lovingly restored facades and gentle pace of life in any of the town’s beautiful squares and old, narrow streets. This small town has a well-deserved place on the UNESCO World Heritage Site list.

Havana’s Tropicana

Discover the place where Nat King Cole, Frank Sinatra, and Josephine Baker took to the stage and where Edith Piaf, Ernest Hemingway and Marlon Brando applauded wildly in the audience: the legendary Tropicana in Havana. With its colourful shows, this cabaret nightclub is just as magical, vivacious, and thrilling as it was when it opened back in 1939.

The capital of Cuba offers a bright and colourful cocktail of colonial history, revolutionary heritage and a timeless joie de vivre. You can really feel the authenticity of this city's charm in old Havana, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and a district defined by imposing fortresses and exuberant shopping streets, baroque churches and monasteries, palaces and wide squares, not to mention the American vintage cars that cruise through the streets. An evening walk along the Malécon seafront promenade is a particular highlight for anyone who wants to experience the real Havana: This is where the locals go when the sun sets – to play chess, make music, go fishing, or simply enjoy a glass or two of rum as they look out at the glistening bay.

Cuban beach heaven

Today's tourists casually unfurl their towels right where the notorious pirates of the Caribbean once buried their treasures. The tiny islands off the coast of Cuba truly are picture-perfect Caribbean paradises. On the Isla de la Juventud and Cayo Largo, you can stroll across beaches of soft white coral sand and wade into the pleasantly warm ocean, or go snorkelling in the crystal-clear waters to see how many colourful sea creatures you can spot.

Marvel at natural beauty spots, live the good life and call at hidden pirate bays: Santo Domingo – Antigua

The magical Maravillas caves

The Spanish name for this natural structure – Cuevas de Maravillas – means “Cave of Wonders”, and for good reason: Visitors to this incredible underground world cannot help but be amazed. With stunning lighting and echoes of cathedral architecture, the ceilings are lined with huge stalactites, while stalagmites protrude from the ground like Gothic pinnacles, and pre-Columbian Taino Indian ritual murals adorn the walls.

The British Virgin Islands – a beautiful sailing destination

The British Virgin Islands, with their white-sand beaches, coral reefs and friendly beach bars, are made up of 60 islands and reefs. When cruising along the Sir Francis Drake Channel, the **SEA CLOUD** calls at two of its stunning natural beauty spots. The tiny islands dotted in the water and warm, gentle breezes make this waterway – named after the famous seafarer – a veritable paradise for sailors.

“The Baths” – imposing granite formations

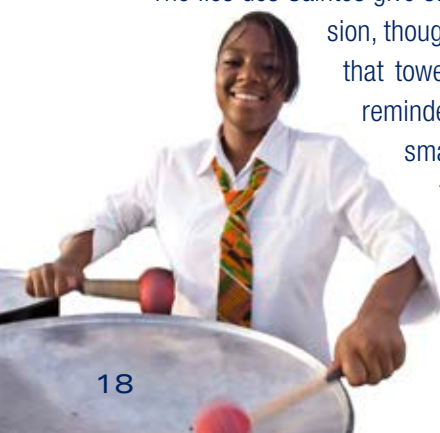

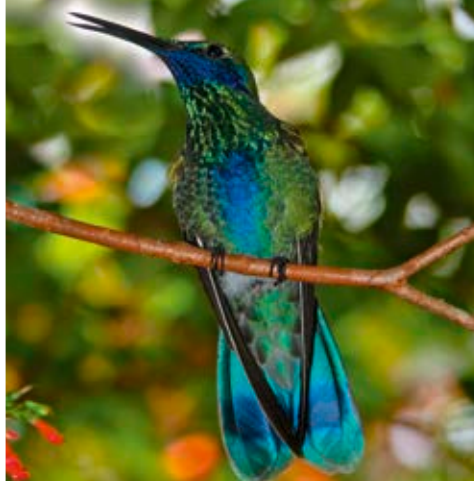

Costa Rica's national parks – a green paradise

As more than a quarter of Costa Rica's land is protected in the form of nature reserves, it provides a safe home for a truly unbelievable variety of flora and fauna. There seems to be no end to the natural highlights that await you in this peaceful little country, which has had no armed forces since 1948. The numerous national parks boast majestic volcanic craters and mysterious cloud forests alongside picturesque beaches and evergreen rain-forests. The Tortuguero National Park, for example, can only be reached by sea or air because its landscape of canals and lagoons is so impenetrable.

The world's second largest coral reef

The Belize Barrier Reef is a 256-kilometre-long (159 miles) reef system which contains countless small coral islands. The Lighthouse Reef Atoll features a particularly special natural wonder: the Great Blue Hole. This circular submarine sinkhole, with a diameter of over 300 metres (0.19 miles), was formed during the last ice age and is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Donning your snorkel and getting an underwater view is obviously another great way to discover the impressive beauty of the reef.

Maya cities in Mexico and Belize

The sophisticated culture of the Maya in Central America, which began roughly 5,000 years ago and ended around the time of the Spanish conquest, is still a mystery. Their ceremonies seem to have been gory, their step pyramids imposing, and their stone carvings required a great deal of skill. On our trip you will discover three mystical Maya strongholds: Tulum, in Mexico, is the only Maya city situated on the coast; Altun Ha and Lamanai are in Belize. Lamanai is situated on the banks of an inland lagoon and remained populated for roughly 3,000 years. Excavations have revealed that over 20,000 people lived there around 700 AD.

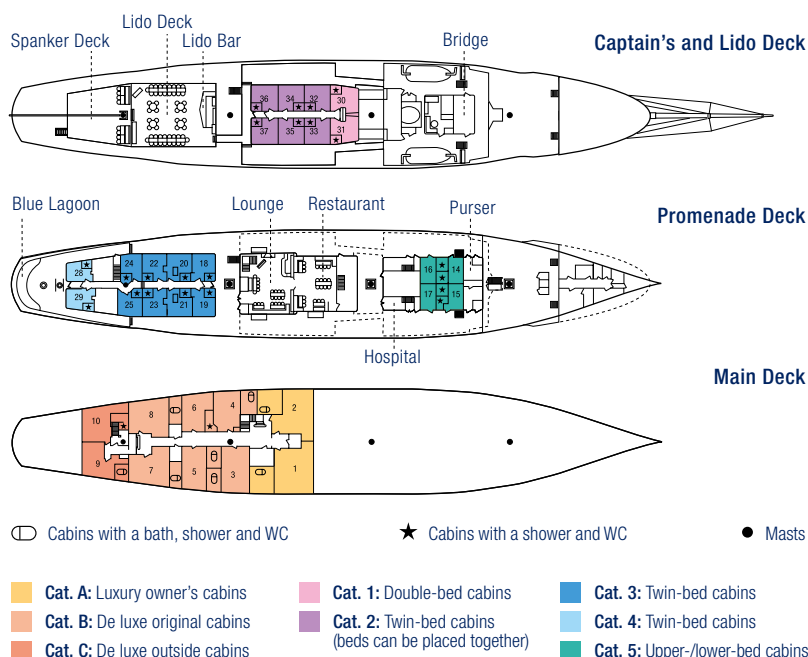

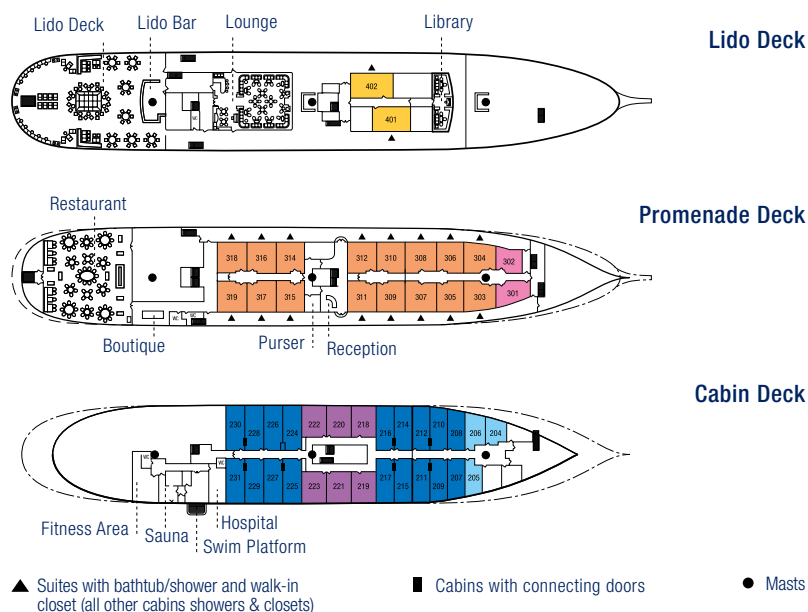
