





## FEATURED PORTS

### TRANSITING THE PANAMA CANAL

Daylight crossings gives you an uncommon glimpse of the Panama Canal. The impressive mechanics float the ship through locks at multiple elevations, leisurely moving from one end of the Canal to the other. Glide from dynamic port cities into remote countryside and farmlands before exiting to another modern cityscape, seeing yesterday and today in rare fashion.

### FUERTE AMADOR (PANAMA CITY), PANAMA

Where the Panama Canal joins the Pacific sits the capital city of Fuerte Amador. More commonly known as Panama City, this overnight port offers insight into the Canal's history, the city's time as a Spanish fort and its present-day role as a major shipping destination and global center of research, business, and entertainment.

### MANTA (QUITO), ECUADOR

Manta's extensive port is a world center for tuna and other fishing, as well as banana agriculture, and its beaches attract surfers and windsurfers worldwide. From here, you can visit the national capital of Quito, a pleasant Spanish colonial UNESCO World Heritage Site located right on the Equator, scenically situated among Andean peaks at over 9,500 feet (2,896 meters).


### ISLAS GUAÑAPE, PERU


A cluster of four tiny islands off the coast of Peru are uninhabited by people, but are teeming with wildlife – particularly seabirds such as Humboldt penguins, blue-footed boobies, terns, and southern sea lions who frequent these protected lands and waters.

### CALLAO (LIMA), PERU

Visit Lima, the "City of Kings" and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, prized for its grand palaces and churches, broad plazas, and unique style of art that blends classical forms with native traditions.

### GENERAL SAN MARTÍN (PISCO), PERU

Pisco dates from 1640, its Plaza de Armas is a Spanish colonial treasure. Another treasure are the Ballestas Islands, an offshore cluster of rocky outcroppings teeming with seabirds, penguins, sea lions, dolphins, and other wildlife.

### SAN ANTONIO (SANTIAGO), CHILE

This large, modern port serves Chile's capital, Santiago, a city with Spanish colonial charm and a vivacious spirit. Encircled by the Andes and the Coastal Range, Santiago is centered around the Plaza de Armas, with several of the city's landmarks: the 18th-century Metropolitan Cathedral the Palacio de la Real Audiencia from 1808, the City Hall, and the National Museum of History.

### PUERTO MONTT, CHILE

Captivating volcanic peaks, Chilean fjords, a vibrant fish market and harbor, and a bustling town-like atmosphere are all part of the colorful experience. Explore white-water rafting, fly-fishing and hiking, or meander through craft stalls of handmade goods as you discover this multifaceted Pacific port.

### ISLA PAN DE AZÚCAR, CHILE

"Sugar Loaf Island" is a nature sanctuary where breeding colonies of sea lions, sea otters, pelicans and other flora and fauna live peacefully among the rocky shores and arid climate influenced by the nearby Atacama Desert. Floating offshore, you'll be in a prime spot to see them all.

### PUNTA ARENAS, CHILE

Punta Arenas is the most important port and commercial center for the immense Patagonian agricultural area of Chile. The economy revolves around the sheep raised on the expansive pampas. Located on the Strait of Magellan separating the mainland from the island of Tierra del Fuego, the city proclaims itself the southernmost city in the world.

## THE ANTARCTIC EXPERIENCE



Largely untouched and blessed with a sub-Antarctic climate and nutrient-rich seas, South Georgia is strikingly green with vegetation and teeming with wildlife, including massive populations of king and other penguin species, fur seals, elephant seals, albatrosses, giant petrels and other seabirds. Whales, orcas and dolphins abound offshore in the most diverse marine ecosystem on earth. Your Captain and Expedition Leader plan your days in South Georgia to offer you a variety of amazing experiences, based on conditions and wildlife reports. Your Expedition Team members accompany you on landings at the various sites in complimentary Zodiacs® and excursions.

## NEW ISLAND, FALKLAND ISLANDS

Windswept New Island, one of the world's most remote inhabited islands, lies on the western fringe of the Falklands Archipelago. A place of colorful landscapes, New Island supports some of the largest concentrations and diversity of wildlife in the Falklands, with over forty species of nesting birds. Four species of penguins, including 13,000 gentoo and 26,000 southern rockhopper penguins call the island home. Embracing winds and seas below, 60,000 black-browed albatross soar along the cliffs. Complimentary Zodiac® and optional kayak excursions enhance your experience.
