The Arctic

In the Arctic, Quark heads to three main areas: Spitsbergen, Greenland and the High Arctic.

Spitsbergen is the largest island in the Svalbard Archipelago, a remote island grouping between Norway and the North Pole—the realm of the polar bear. It's celebrated for its abundance of wildlife, along with the rugged terrain and rich early-expedition history.

Greenland has two personalities: a remote and pristine east coast with its glacial bays and soaring mountains, and the more populated west coast, a cultural and historical treasure and a nature-lover's paradise.

In the High Arctic, we encounter some of the most breathtaking areas imaginable with two new itineraries. You can now cruise the channels of the iconic Northwest Passage, following in the footsteps of Sir John Franklin and the early explorers, tripping up the coasts of Baffin Island or Greenland. Our ultimate adventure—crushing through ice to the North Pole—continues to fascinate even the most intrepid of explorers. Captivating land and ice adventures in the remote Canadian north and Arctic Ocean round out our Arctic offerings.

Antarctica

At the other end of the world, the Antarctic Peninsula is a study in contrasts. You sail into iceberg-filled bays and along rugged coasts, visiting penguin rookeries and abandoned whaling stations. Setting foot on the 7th continent, crossing the Antarctic Circle or following in the footsteps of early explorers like Sir Ernest Shackleton are travel feats few can lay claim to.

In the Antarctic, where you go really depends on how much time you have. Crossing the Drake Passage is first on the agenda. This is a rite of passage for some. For others, it's part of the journey they can skip via our express itineraries that fly over the Drake and into the heart of the action.

The British territories of the Falkland Islands (Malvinas) and South Georgia in the South Atlantic Ocean are known for their abundance of wildlife and absorbing histories. Both give you opportunities to connect with wildlife, and hike the tundra and shorelines. These are often favourite destinations for those lucky enough to revisit Antarctica.

As well, using a polar destination as a jumping-off point to other regions is another way to experience the bio-diversity of the South Atlantic Ocean. North or south, the polar regions are spectacular, each in its own unique way. Reaching one of these travel milestones will be an achievement you'll never forget.



Night Landing

I managed a quick two hours of sleep after dinner, then was awakened around midnight by expedition leader Hadleigh Measham announcing the call for a night-time excursion to witness the Northern Lights on shore.

We were warmed up to the idea of a night landing the day before, when Measham let the word out, pulling out a bag of glow sticks. "What are those for?" we wondered. He said his reasoning for going ashore at night was to give-the photographers in the group a more stable base for their tripods than the top deck of the ship. It sounded a bit maverick, like we were not playing by the rules. When talk grew more serious the next day and staff members became noticeably excited, it became more of a reality—something special.

Throwing on my clothes and venturing out on deck, I could see glowing green stripes of light starting to take shape in the sky.

Our Zodiac headed right for the red light on the shoreline, to find that the perimeter of our viewing area was

ringed with...the glow sticks, as well as four armed guides posted on all four corners. This is polar bear country, after all.

People were quietly setting up their photo gear or staking out their spots in the deep grass, barely visible despite our bright yellow parkas. I wasn't really equipped to take proper photos, so I just lay on my back and captured the memory instead.

And then the show started. The Northern Lights danced completely across the sky in a multi-hued vision of beauty for more than half an hour. I had to really turn my head to take in as much of the sky as possible, because the lights would shift from one horizon to the other and back again. I almost drifted off, my nose tucked into my jacket, forgetting to watch.

This, I thought, is what really makes an expedition— a special one-off, something outside the regular program. The staff took what sounded like a lark and turned it into a reality. And I can still see it in my mind's eye.




Call of the Wild

We had the most perfect day as we approached Franz Josef Land, an archipelago surrounded by the Arctic Ocean, Barents Sea and Kara Sea. It was so sunny when I woke up, I had to open the window, seeing plumes of mist in the air—and then three bowhead whales not that far from the ship. This was very auspicious, as later on we saw more whales off the bow and starboard sides. It was like they came to greet us and welcome us to these islands that few people ever see.

The surprises weren't over yet. Towards evening, an announcement came over the ship's speakers that a polar bear had been spotted off the bow. I raced up for a view. I couldn't believe how close he was or how curious. There were about 100 people on deck, all standing silently in the presence of this magnificent bear.

He was mesmerizing: the tufts of fur coming off his front legs, his huge paws, how he sniffed in the air. I took a few photos and videos and then put my camera away. To see him without the viewfinder was incredible. He was very close to us, at the edge of a vast expanse of white ice and blue water. His home is this Arctic ice. Tears rolled down my face. It was cathartic, an experience I've only had once before when I saw the Northern Lights. It was overwhelming to stand in the beauty of nature and be part of something so magical. I think the bear looked each and every passenger in the eye as he checked us out. Everyone was so moved by that bear. I watched him for 30 minutes before he left us. And as I stood on the deck while he walked away, I thought to myself, *This may be the best day of my life*.



We flew in a helicopter over the Antarctic Peninsula and landed about a mile away from a newly found area for Emperor penguins, then walked the rest of the way in. This trek through the snow to visit the colonies was superb—the route was marked with flags and easy to follow. For most of the time, I was alone and couldn't see anyone—it was just me, surrounded by the pure white landscape with a few penguins parading at my left or right. There was a breeze and I just felt complete solitude. We had four days at Snow Hill, real penguin overload, but I was happy to be in my own little world with them.

I tend to go things alone most of the time as a solo traveler. At 76 years old, I still like to wander into the ship lounge for a cocktail to chat with other passengers. For me, the penguins weren't the only star of the show.

I've been aboard the *Kapitan Khlebnikov* (KK) seven times and to experience plowing through thick sheets of ice on that powerhouse is unreal. Other repeat KK travelers will agree with me. On this trip, I saw a Japanese fellow I had met before and while we couldn't communicate directly with each other, we exchanged friendly smiles, sharing in the fandom of that incredible ship.

That's the thing about these kind of trips—there's always something you don't anticipate, like forming real bonds with other passengers that makes it extra special, and I should know because I've been on almost a dozen trips. You only get so many chances at things in your lifetime and you can't miss the kind of opportunity to connect with both people and nature in a very powerful way. You've just got to be there to truly understand it.







After cruising from Ushuaia for three days, we arrived in South Georgia. And it was during our landings on Salisbury Plain and St. Andrews Bay that I was filled with so much emotion I was overwhelmed. My eyes filling with tears as penguins greeted me on the beach, flapping their wings and bobbing their heads, each making their own individual call. What struck me most was how privileged I was to set foot on this incredibly beautiful land teeming with animals: fur seals, elephant seals and large colonies of king penguins in various stages of preening, egg-laying, nesting and moulting. There were as many as 100,000 pairs.



"Walk to the right of the red flags," our guide said, pointing up ahead toward the penguin rookery. "Don't walk closer than 15 feet. But if they approach you, that's fine."

The rookery was like a sea of king penguins. And while individual penguins could be seen in the mass, the overall impression was abstract, like a painting of silver, black and white, penguins nestled together, caring for their eggs or feeding the chicks. The cacophony was deafening and my senses were in overdrive, as was my camera.

Up close and personal, the king penguins did their special dance—squawking, rocking and waddling so close to me that I could have stroked their smooth feathers and touche

their bright but sharp beaks. I conveyed my emotions silently, experiencing the magic of nature—seeing them, smelling them and wanting to touch them and communicate somehow. They had their own thing going; making squawking sounds, shaking their heads, slapping each other with their wings as if to say, "Hey! I was here first!"

I pressed my camera's continuous shutter—click, click, click. Then I remembered what our expedition leader told us the night before: Watch. Listen. Absorb. I put down my camera, sat on a small wobbly rock and got goosebumps as I did just that.

1. RESERVATIONS & PAYMENT

Currency

Quark Expeditions accepts payment in four currencies: US Dollars (US\$), Australian Dollars (AU\$), Euros (€) and Pounds Sterling (£). The currency will be applied based on the location of the client. Once the initial deposit/payment has been paid, all subsequent fees/charges will be applied in the same currency. Quark reserves the right to adjust prices based on exchange rates without notice.

Reservations by Telephone

To confirm reservations on all Quark products, a deposit of 20% (unless indicated otherwise at time of booking) of the gross, non-discounted rate (minimum US\$1,000, AU\$1,000, €800, £650 per person) is required at time of booking. The deposit may be paid by bank wire transfer, check, money order or major credit card. For any booking within 120 days of departure, full payment is required. Deposit amounts may vary for special promotions and are subject to the promotion terms and conditions.

Booking Online

To confirm reservations on all Quark products, a deposit of 20% (unless indicated otherwise at time of booking) of the gross, non-discounted rate (minimum US\$1,000, AU\$1,300, €880, £650 per person) is required at time of booking. The deposit must be paid by major credit card. For any bookings within 120 days of departure, full payment is required.

Final Payments

Balances are due 120 days prior to departure. Final payment can be made by calling Quark (final payment cannot be made online) and may be paid by major credit card, bank wire or check. Deposits and payments for preexpedition and post-expedition services are specific to each item and are explained and communicated at time of purchase.

Late Payments

All late payments are subject to a penalty of 1.5% interest per month or 18% per annum. Quark reserves the right to cancel any booking that is not paid within 120 days of departure or deny boarding on any unpaid balances.

Special Requests

2. EMERGENCY EVACUATION INSURANCE & TRAVEL INSURANCE

Due to the remoteness of where we travel, an adequate medical facility could be 72 hours away or more, and emergency evacuation and adequate medical treatment may be delayed or unavailable in certain areas.

2.1 Emergency Evacuation Coverage, Complimentary for all Quark guests

Emergency evacuation insurance, to a maximum benefit per paying traveler of US\$500,000, is included complimentary in the cost of all Quark Expeditions trips. Included coverage is applicable only to travel occurring between the first and last day of the expedition purchased from Quark. All requests for cancellation must be received in writing. Cancellations cannot be made online. We reserve the right to cancel any services prior to departure, in which case payment will be refunded without further obligation on its part.

The expedition staff reserve the right to deny participation to any client who has not signed the adventure option waiver, does not follow the rules set out by expedition staff or is reasonably deemed not medically/physically able to participate safely. For the avoidance of doubt, providers of any such adventure options are independent contractors and neither QEI, its affiliates, owners, officers, agents, employees, contractors, nor any associate organization shall be held liable for any act, default, injury (including emotional injury, injury to person or property, or death), loss, expense, damage, deviation, delay, curtailment or inconvenience caused to or suffered by any person or their property, howsoever arising, which may occur or be incurred by any such provider.

6. CHILDREN

Quark welcomes passengers above age 8 on all trips with a signed waiver by a parent prior to trip commencement. There are however some caveats and restrictions to be aware of:

6.1 Children on Ship-based Trips

Quark welcomes passengers above the age of 8 and under the age of 16 at time of travel with a signed waiver by a parent prior to commencement on any Quark trip, provided they meet height and weight requirements (weight of 64lbs or 29kg and 48" or 1.2 m. tall). Children under 8 years old at the time of travel are not allowed to participate on the trip.

6.1.1 Children on Ship-based Adventure Options

Adventure options on ships are available for all persons over the age of 16. Children under the age of 16 are not allowed to participate in adventure options. Parents must be with children under the age of 16 at all times, so the parent's participation in adventure options may be limited.

6.2 Children on Land-based Trips

6.2.1 Arctic Watch Wilderness Lodge

Children 8 to 16 years of age are welcome to participate in adventure options along with parental supervision. Some specific activities have additional restrictions: ATVing (All-Terrain Vehicle). Children 16 and older can operate an all-terrain vehicle (ATV) after demonstrating that they have an acceptable level of skill to handle and maneuver an ATV. However, if the Quark expedition staff overseeing the adventure option deem that anyone is not demonstrating an acceptable level of skill to safely participate in the activity, the expedition staff, at their sole and exclusive discretion, can respectfully disallow the continued participation in the adventure option, in consideration of the participants and other participants' safety and enjoyment. Children under the age of 16 may ride as passengers with an adult over age 18. Parents must be with children under the age of 16 at all times, so the parent's participation in adventure options may be limited.

6.2.2 Barneo Ice Camp

Children above age 16 will be accepted at Barneo Ice Camp.

7. PRE- & POST-TRAVEL

Pre- and post-travel options arranged by Quark may not be refundable after the booking is made. A US\$350 (or equivalent) deposit is required at time of booking. The deposit is non-refundable at time of booking. Cancellations received less than 120 days before departure are 100% non-refundable.

8. TRIP CANCELLATION BY QUARK EXPEDITIONS PRIOR TO ITINERARY START DATE

If the expedition is interrupted, the itinerary changed or if the vessel/camp is unduly delayed or prevented from proceeding in the ordinary course by: acts of God; perils of the sea, harbors, rivers, or other navigable waters; act of any governmental or ruling authority; epidemic; collision; stranding; fire; faults or errors in navigation or management of this or of any other vessel/camp; seizure of the vessel/camp under legal process; any abrupt or unexpected increase in the cost of fuel or shortage of fuel; war; hostilities; riots; strikes or labor stoppages; or any other cause or circumstance beyond Quark's or the vessel/camp owner's responsibility or control, Quark and/or

the vessel/camp owner shall have the right, in its sole discretion, to terminate the expedition and to land the traveler and his baggage at any port or place at which the vessel/camp may call at or may then be. In such event, this travel package shall be considered to have been fully performed as if the expedition were completed and the responsibility of Quark shall cease without any liability on the part of Quark to refund any part of the fare. In the event that Quark cancels the expedition or changes the itinerary for any one or more of the reasons set forth above and the traveler has not yet embarked, the responsibility of Quark shall cease upon such cancellation without any liability on the part of Quark to refund any part of the fare. It is understood that such decisions will be made in the best interests of all travelers aboard and with regard to the safety of the vessel/camp. Before or after the commencement of the expedition, Quark, the vessel/camp and the master shall have liberty to: proceed without pilots; tow and assist vessel/ camps in all situations; deviate from the usual advertised or scheduled route; put back to or into or to call or stop, or omit to call or stop, at any port or place, on land or at sea, in or out of the route of the usual, advertised or scheduled expedition, even though doing so may involve going backwards or away from the port of destination; adjust compasses; dry dock, go on ways and/or be towed. These things may be done for any reasons which are sufficient in the judgement of Quark, the vessel/camp owner and/or the master, including but not limited to, offering or rendering assistance in an effort to preserve life or property. If the master and/or Quark, for any reason whatsoever consider it necessary or desirable in the good management of the vessel/camp, they may cause the vessel/ camp not to make calls at any port or ports or to land or board travelers or their baggage. A traveler scheduled to land at an omitted port or place of final destination may be landed with his baggage at the next practical port of call without any liability on the part of Quark. Travelers have no right to any refund or other considerations in the event of these itinerary changes.

Quark will reasonably assist participants in changing their travel arrangements and provide trip interruption letters for all participants to submit to their travel insurance providers under their trip interruption travel policy. It is for this reason that QUARK EXPEDITIONS HIGHLY RECOMMENDS TRIP INTERRUPTION AND CANCELLATION INSURANCE. Furthermore, included activities or excursions within a trip itinerary could conceivably be canceled or rearranged with little or no notice as a result of factors out of our control, such as, for example, a Force Majeure Event, and no refunds will be issued for any unused activities. Any trip extensions already undertaken are not eligible for any refunds or cancellation/interruption letters.

8.1.2 All Antarctic Express, Arctic Express and Bespoke Fly/Cruises

Due to the nature of Quark's Antarctic Express, Arctic Express and Bespoke Fly/
Cruises where weather conditions may delay or require a cancellation of the remaining itinerary after four to six days of attempts to operate flights: QUARK EXPEDITIONS WILL OFFER PASSENGERS A FULL REFUND ON THE CRUISE FARE IN THE EVENT OF TRIP INTERRUPTION IF THE CHARTER FLIGHT IS NOT ABLE TO TAKE OFF BY 14:00 (11:59 FOR ARCTIC EXPRESS GREENLAND) HOURS OF THE FINAL DAY OF ATTEMPTS.

The interruption policy for Quark's Antarctic Express and Arctic Express Greenland programs are set forth in the Contingency Plan below.

9. CONTINGENCY PLAN: QUARK'S ANTARCTIC/ARCTIC EXPRESS ANTARCTIC EXPRESS (7, 8 AND 11 DAY ITINERARIES) & ARCTIC EXPRESS GREENLAND (10 DAY ITINERARY)

Quark will make every effort to ensure the Antarctic and Arctic Express programs take place, but due to weather conditions, flying in this region can be difficult and is beyond the control of Quark. The table below illustrates the last itinerary day on which an attempt will be made to fly:

In the rare instance where on the final day for flight attempts the flight was still not successfully completed, Quark has the right to interrupt the trip. Quark reserves the right to extend the final attempt day if weather conditions are improving. If the trip is interrupted: QUARK EXPEDITIONS WILL PROVIDE A FULL REFUND FOR THE FULL CRUISE FARE AND ANY UNUSED ADVENTURE OPTIONS. No refund will be provided if the flight is successfully completed regardless of which day of the itinerary it was executed.

International airfare, domestic airfare, any additional services purchased or change fees, will not be refunded by Quark. Quark will provide a trip interruption letter to be submitted by the passenger to their insurance company for airfare, change fees, and other expenses incurred due to the trip interruption.

Quark will issue the cruise fare refund back in the same form/medium in which payment was received. QUARK STRONGLY RECOMMENDS THAT ALL EXPEDITION GUESTS PURCHASE A TRAVEL INSURANCE POLICY INCLUDING TRIP DELAY, CANCELLATION AND INTERRUPTION INSURANCE.

In addition, Quark will attempt to re-book passengers on the same itinerary or another Quark vessel in the area with availability. However, in not all cases is this possible as there may not be any available cabins or voyages remaining.

9.1 Contingency Plan Itinerary

Day 1

Quark reserves the right to send passengers on the charter plane the evening prior to the scheduled day. This may happen when we see a weather system that could cause a delay on subsequent days. It is for this reason that we request all passengers to arrive in Punta Arenas no later than 3:00 pm on Day 1.

Day 2, 3, 4, 5, 6

For each day of the itinerary after Day 1, if there is a delay, all guests will be briefed by the Quark ground staff on the flight status. Often times we are waiting for a weather window to depart and could be required to leave with very little notice. All guests and staff will be on stand-by until approximately 14:00 hours (11:59 for Arctic Express itineraries).

During the stand-by period, you must be at the airport, or at another location designated by the Quark ground staff to be ready to go if and when a suitably long weather window becomes available. If by 14:00 (Antarctica) or 11:59 (Arctic) hours the flight remains delayed, you will be returned back to your respective hotels or you may choose to join additional excursions for the afternoon compliments of Quark. Quark will provide complimentary guided tours to sites of historic, cultural or wildlife interests. Quark will provide additional night(s) hotel accommodation and meals. Quark reserves the right to make exceptions to the timing guidelines outlined in this section.

9.2 Priority of Flight Departure (Antarctica)

In some cases, there are instances where more than one operator is waiting for a weather window to fly passengers to King George Island using the same charter planes. In these cases, the priority is given to the passengers who were first delayed. The charter flight operator is contractually bound to respect the priority in which delays occurred.

9.3 Last Itinerary Day for Flight Attempts

In the event that the charter flight is unable to fly on the final itinerary attempt day for any reason by 14:00 for Antarctica or 11:59 for Arctic itineraries on:

Day 4 for the Antarctic Express:

Fly the Drake 8-day itinerary Day 5 for the Arctic Express: Greenland's Northern Lights 10-day itinerary Day 6 for the Antarctic Express: Crossing the Circle 11-day

Quark will officially interrupt the voyage and provide a full refund for the full cruise fare and unused activities. In order for passengers to obtain reimbursement for their airfare and potentially other costs to change flights, Quark will provide trip interruption letters for all clients to submit to their travel insurance providers under the trip delay/interruption and cancellation clause (provided passengers have included airfare to be covered in their travel protection plan). Quark will provide a final additional night hotel accommodation. Any additional hotel nights and meals will be the responsibility of the guests. Quark reserves the right to make exceptions to the timing guidelines outlined in this section.

*Note: For the 7-Day Antarctic Express: Fly the Drake itinerary, if in the event the flight does successfully leave on Day 4, the voyage will be a South Shetland Islands voyage only and will not go to the Antarctica Peninsula. A departure on any other day (2 or 3), the itinerary will still include the Antarctica Peninsula.

9.4 Returning Passengers

Passengers on board the ship during these delays will remain on board at no additional cost until the time in which the charter flight is able to arrange transport. Full board and all excursions are included. No refund will be issued for any reason whatsoever. Quark advises all clients to book changeable airline tickets along with cancellation and interruption insurance to assist with additional airline change fees. We advise all passengers to have flexible travel arrangements upon disembarkation of the voyage if delays arise. Quark will not be held responsible for any change/cancellation fees due to weather related delays or any other delays arising from force majeure. FOR CANCELLATION DUE TO ALL OTHER EVENTS OF FORCE MAJEURE, THE STANDARD NON-CONTINGENCY PLAN TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF QUARK EXPEDITIONS SHALL APPLY.

9.5 Flight Changes Due to an Interrupted or Delayed Voyage

For faster service, Quark strongly recommends that all clients contact the airline they are traveling on for changes directly.

If flights booked with Quark: Quark ground staff are able to assist passengers that have booked their flights with Quark to make necessary flight changes. Any additional costs such as change fees or additional costs are the responsibility of the passengers.

If flights booked with an External Agent: You must contact that agent or the airline directly to change your flights, as Quark ground staff are not able to access your flight information to make the necessary changes.

10. ARCTIC WATCH WILDERNESS LODGE

Quark will make every effort to ensure the Arctic Watch Wilderness Lodge charter flights take place as scheduled, but due to uncertain weather conditions, flying in this region can be difficult, and delays can be unpredictable and are beyond the control of Quark. In the event that the charter flight to Arctic Watch is delayed by one day, Quark will accommodate delayed guests in Yellowknife at Quark's expense, for one additional night ONLY. All meals, room charges, and any other expenses are the responsibility of the guest. In the event of a charter flight delay longer than one day, ALL expenses, including additional accommodations and meals will be at the guest's expense.

Guests already at Arctic Watch, who are affected by a charter flight delay, will receive one-night accommodation in Yellowknife at Quark's expense on the day of arrival from Arctic Watch to Yellowknife. All other expenses related to a charter flight delay, including meals, room charges, and flight cancellation or rebooking fees, are the responsibility of the guest. We strongly recommend that all expedition guests purchase a travel insurance policy that includes trip delay, cancellation and interruption insurance.

QUARK EXPEDITIONS WILL NOT OFFER PASSENGERS A REFUND IN THE EVENT OF TRIP CANCELLATION. QUARK WILL NOT OFFER PASSENGERS ANY COMPENSATION (INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO COMPENSATION FOR OUT OF POCKET EXPENSES OR UNUSED TIME AT ARCTIC WATCH) IN THE EVENT OF A DELAY FOR ANY LENGTH OF TIME.

11. AMENDMENTS TO BOOKINGS

Quark will make every effort to assist in changing your reservation; however, changes must be submitted in writing a minimum of 120 days prior to departure. If the amendment is possible, it will be subject to a minimum

US\$250, AU\$325, €220, £160 per person fee, plus any difference in fare if applicable. Amendments include name changes but not voyage changes.

12. TRANSFERS OF DEPOSITS OR PAYMENTS TO ALTERNATE EXPEDITIONS

Should travelers be unable to take the expedition they originally booked, but would like to travel on an alternate date, it may be possible to transfer deposits or payments from the original booking to an alternate booking, subject to the following conditions: The new expedition must occur within one year of the original expedition date and a request to transfer must be made in writing to Quark more than 120 days prior to the departure of the original voyage. Quark reserves the right to prohibit transfers on any of its expeditions. Should a transfer request be granted, a fee of minimum US\$1,250, AU\$1,600, €1,100, £830 per person will be charged.

13. MEDICAL TREATMENT & FORMS Medical forms will be sent to you via email

link once the deposit has been received. You must review, complete and submit the forms. Questions that relate to your physical or mental suitability must be completed by a medical practitioner. Quark cannot offer medical advice. Medical forms must be filled out in full, honestly and accurately, and disclose all medical history and information. Should your medical situation change after submitting the medical forms, it is your responsibility to advise Quark immediately. Quark will review the information submitted and reserves the right to ask for further information, clarity on information, or for documentation from your medical practitioner. Quark reserves the right to deny passage to any participant on reasonable medical grounds or disembark any passenger at any port or place at any time or transfer the accommodations of or confine to a cabin/room any passenger who may be suffering from contagious or infectious disease; whose presence, in the opinion of the expedition staff or master of the vessel/camp, may be detrimental to the comfort or safety of himself, other travelers, the vessel/camp, its officers or crew, or who, in the opinion of the expedition staff or master, might be excluded from landing at any port or place by immigration or other governmental authorities. For travelers that book within 120 days of departure, completed medical forms must be received within seven days of making payment. Quark reserves the right to deny entry/ boarding, without refund or resulting expenses, to any traveler at the pier or starting point of a trip itinerary for any reason at its sole discretion, including but not limited to in the event that the on-board medical officer determines that the traveler has not disclosed accurate medical information. Before boarding the vessel or joining a trip/camp, each traveler must have an adequate

Quark cannot guarantee that the vessel/camp will carry a physician or medical personnel on board/ in camp. If the vessel/camp does carry a physician or medical personnel, then they are deemed to be acting as independent contractors on behalf of the traveler. Any physician or other medical personnel that renders emergency treatment and/ or performs medical or surgical services, does so at the rates fixed in the Schedule of Physician's Charges posted aboard the vessel/camp or as otherwise agreed to, or in the absence thereof, then at a customary rate. If, in the reasonable opinion of the expedition staff or the Master of the vessel/camp, a passenger in need of medical or surgical services is unable to request it, the traveler hereby expressly consents to such treatment, if deemed necessary, and to pay the cost thereof charged by the vessel/camp's physician or other physician or medical personnel.

All medicines and all medical or surgical services furnished by the vessel/camp's physician, if any, or any other physician or medical personnel (all of whom are engaged by the traveler as independent contractors) or ship's officers, employees, agents of the vessel/camp owner or expedition staff shall be and are accepted by and at the traveler's sole risk and expense, and Quark shall not be responsible for the quality, nature or consequence thereof.

14. ADDITIONAL TRAVEL DOCUMENTS

The traveler must be in possession of a valid passport and any visas, permits, inoculations and certificates (including health certificates) that are required for the duration of the services provided by Quark and be able to satisfy all requirements of all immigration, port or health authorities of the port(s) of disembarkation and of the country of ultimate destination. If immigration or other government authorities refuse a traveler permission to land, or give orders for deportation, the traveler shall be responsible for all costs incurred by the traveler, Quark and/ or the carrier. The traveler must also arrange such vaccinations as are normally recommended for the countries through which they intend to travel. Information about these matters and climate, clothing, baggage, gear, and similar items is given in good faith but without responsibility on the part of Quark. Each traveler must ensure each piece of baggage brought on board the vessel/camp is marked with the traveler's full name and address. The traveler is responsible for payment of any excess baggage charges levied by the vessel/camp owner and agrees not to bring on board any firearms, flammable, inflammable or hazardous items, controlled or prohibited substances or drugs, contraband or items prohibited by any country or port to be visited. The traveler shall not be entitled to get off from the vessel/camp at an intermediate port or place except as set out in the itinerary

or with prior written approval of the carrier and if the traveler does so, it is at the traveler's own risk and expense and no exceptions will be made in such cases. If such disembarkation violates any law, including United States Code, Title 46 Section 289, the traveler shall be liable to reimburse Quark and/or the carrier for any penalty provided by statute, law or governmental regulation. If the traveler misses any scheduled sailing of the vessel/camp from any port or place, neither Quark nor the carrier shall be liable for any costs, expenses or damages incurred by the traveler as a result thereof, and the traveler shall not be entitled to any refund of the fare.

All travelers must abide by all Rules and Regulations posted onboard the vessel/camp. Any questions about the Rules and Regulations should be directed to the expedition staff or the vessel/camp's Master or purser.

The traveler acknowledges that the Master of the vessel/camp may alter the accommodation arrangements at any time and may allocate other accommodations to travelers. The fare and the standard of accommodations will, if possible, be substantially the same. The vessel/camp owner shall have a lien on (claim against and right to sell) the baggage, money (including the fare) and any other property accompanying the traveler to satisfy any claims it may have against the traveler. The vessel/camp owner may enforce this lien by public or private sale in any manner and without notice except where required by applicable law.

No pets or animals are allowed on the vessel/camp.

15. RATES

All fares are quoted in US Dollars (US\$), Australian Dollars (AU\$), Euros (€) and Pounds Sterling (£). Rates for expeditions, flights, as well as optional pre-expedition and postexpedition extensions are based on tariffs and exchange rates in effect at the time of printing and are subject to change prior to departure. Substantial changes in tariffs, exchange rates and the price of fuel, services and labor sometimes increase the cost of expedition arrangements significantly. Quark reserves the right to alter prices or introduce surcharges accordingly, even if payment has been received in full. All travelers are required to pay for their excursion and additional purchases in conjunction with their excursion in the same currency. The fare does not include tobacco, alcoholic or special beverages (bottled or tap), miscellaneous extras, personal needs or medical care. Such goods and services, if available for purchase aboard the vessel/camp, are at the travelers own expense. Payment for all such goods and services including any charges for extra baggage must be made in cash or by traveler's checks in US dollars (or other currency acceptable to the carrier) upon demand by the carrier prior to the traveler's disembarkation. Taxes, port charges, embarkation and loading expenses, stamps, health fees and any other charges whatsoever imposed by governmental authorities in any port or place shall be for the account of the traveler if not included in the fare paid to Quark.

16. DISCOUNTS & PROMOTIONS

Quark has the right to limit, withdraw or change any and/or all discounts and promotions without notice and/or compensation.

17. SCHEDULED FLIGHTS

Tours do not include international airfare or any other flights unless mentioned in the inclusions.

Ouotes

All quotes are in US dollars. Quark cannot quote or book flights in foreign currency.

Price Changes

Until the tickets are issued, Quark reserves the right to change prices for any reason, including, but not limited to, airfares wrongfully quoted due to system error, the price of fuel and/or currency fluctuations or government taxes or levies, or any other reasonable cause.

Full Payment

Full payment must be received by Quark before the option period expires to guarantee the flight reservation at quoted price. A guarantee of payment by the client is an acceptance of the travel arrangements as requested at the total price quoted. Cancellation fees will apply if the client subsequently decides to cancel after tickets have been issued.

Changes and Cancellations

Unless otherwise stated, airline tickets are 100% non-changeable and non-refundable once tickets have been issued. Changes made prior to ticket issuance may be applied at Quark's discretion, and will also be subject to administrative fees.

Flight Reconfirmation

Quark strongly recommends flight times and numbers be verified or reconfirmed at least 72 hours prior to departure. Quark is not responsible for any change to airline schedules or flight numbers after tickets have been issued.

Airline Tickets

Once issued, all airline tickets are non-transferable and are valid only for the dates and routings shown. If an airline ticket is lost, the client is responsible for the full cost of a new ticket and any changes that may occur in replacement.

Baggage

All airline tickets come with baggage restrictions or no free baggage allowance. Please check directly with your airline for up-to-the-minute baggage rules, as additional fees may apply and are the responsibility of the passenger.

Airline, Airport or Weather Delays

Quark will not be held responsible for any additional expenses or loss that may arise from airline, airport or weather delays. Quark will not reimburse for any additional expenses incurred by the client as a result. Quark will not refund any unused portion of air tickets purchased in the event of such delays due to conditions beyond its control.

For scheduled flights, the fare rules of the airline carrier, including payment and cancellation conditions, apply.

18. CHARTER FLIGHTS

Charter flights are at an additional cost unless otherwise stated. Quark reserves the right to change charter flight costs based on fuel surcharges or increased charter hire rates. Charter flights have strict luggage allowances; all charter flights have a total luggage allowance of 20 kg per person total unless otherwise stated.

19. COMPENSATION

Compensation for personal injury is limited in accordance with the provisions of International Conventions, but only to the extent such International Conventions apply. These include, for example, in the course of road travel, air travel, rail travel, sea travel, or hotel accommodation, and are limited to the provisions of, respectively, the Geneva Convention 1973, the Warsaw Convention as amended by The Hague Protocol 1955, the 1961 Berne Convention, the 1974 Athens Convention and the 1962 Paris Convention.

20. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

Quark purchases transportation, hotel accommodations, and other services from various independent suppliers that are not subject to its control. These suppliers are independent contractors. Neither QEI, its affiliates, owners, officers, agents, employees, contractors, nor any associate organization shall be held liable for any act, default, injury (including emotional injury, injury to person or property, or death), loss, expense, damage, deviation, delay, curtailment or inconvenience caused to or suffered by any person or their property, howsoever arising, which may occur or be incurred by any organization or person, even though such act, default, injury, loss, expense, damage, deviation, delay, curtailment or inconvenience may have been caused or contributed to: (a) by the act, neglect or default of QEI, or of any persons for whom it would otherwise be responsible, or (b) defects or failures of any aircraft, vessel/camp, automotive vehicle or other equipment or instrumentality under the control of independent suppliers. In issuing tickets for transportation of the travel by any means and making arrangements for travel, hotel or other accommodation, QEI is not acting as principal but only as agent for the companies, corporations, owner, public carriers or persons providing or offering the means of transportation and accommodation. You further understand that QEI neither owns nor operates such third party suppliers and accordingly, agree to seek remedies directly and only against those suppliers and not hold QEI responsible for their acts or omissions. In no event will QEI be responsible for incidental, consequential or special damage or loss suffered by any person. QEI's maximum liability, for any reason whatsoever, will be limited to the amount paid to QEI for its services. Without limitation, QEI is not responsible for any negligent acts or omissions of itself or of any persons for

whom it would otherwise be responsible, or acts which are beyond its control, including but not limited to acts of God or force majeure, weather emergencies, breakdown, or failure of diving or mechanical equipment, government actions, inclement weather, sickness, attacks by animals, availability of emergency evacuation or medical care or the adequacy of the same, criminal activity of any kind, terrorism, war, civil disturbance, sanitary conditions, quality or sanitation of food, quarantine, customs, regulations, epidemics, strikes, hotel overbooking, safety and/or security standards at hotels, accommodations or otherwise, or for any other reason beyond the control of QEI. You understand, agree with, and agree to be legally bound by the terms of the release and waiver of liability set forth herein.

QEI shall not be responsible for any injury to person (including emotional injury or physical injury and whether or not resulting in death) or damage to property arising out of any act of war, insurrection, revolt or other civil uprising or military action occurring in the countries of origin, destination or passage.

In the case of a medical problem arising during the voyage, either on board or on shore, which results in costs for evacuation, use of aircraft or repatriation, the responsibility for payment of these costs belongs solely to the traveler if costs incurred are above that of the Emergency Evacuation Insurance. The conditions of carriage in use by the carriers concerned (when issued) shall constitute the sole contract between the transportation companies and the purchaser of these services and/or passage. By accepting the ticket, the traveler also agrees to its terms and conditions.

The traveler accepts that the vessel/camp owner does not undertake to carry as baggage any electronics, computers, merchandise, samples, furniture, household goods, tools of trade, property of persons other than the traveler, pictures, works of art, perishable or breakable goods, glassware, liquids, bric-a-brac, money, securities and notes, whether or not negotiable, documents, valuables, gold, silver, silverware, precious stones and metals or jewelry. If any such items or articles are brought aboard, the traveler expressly agrees that neither Quark nor the vessel/camp owner shall have any liability for loss or damage howsoever caused, even if by the negligence of Quark or the vessel/camp owner. The traveler is not allowed to bring on board items or articles, the importation or exportation of which may be forbidden, or which do not conform to the customs or police regulations or the laws of any country to which the vessel/ camp may go in the course of the expedition. A traveler who violates this rule will be held liable for all resulting fines, losses, damages or delays. The traveler is not allowed to place in baggage any firearms or any flammable or inflammable matter of any kind, such as matches, gunpowder, fireworks, cigarette lighters, cartridges, films, etc. Quark and/or the vessel/camp owner may dispose of or destroy such items without liability.

The traveler will be liable for the full amount of all loss, damage or delay to the vessel/camp or her cargo and for all injury to, or death of any fellow travelers, expedition staff, officers or crew or other persons caused by such hazardous articles brought on board by the traveler.

Each passenger on board a ship is allowed to bring aboard baggage not exceeding 250 pounds in weight and not exceeding 25 cubic feet in volume. The traveler may be charged for baggage in excess thereof at the vessel/camp owner's current rate. You also realize and acknowledge that risk and dangers may be caused by the negligence, fault or wrongdoing of the owners, directors, employees, contractors, subcontractors, officers or agents of QEI or of other participants, contractors and/ or subcontractors to QEI. You also recognize and acknowledge that risk and dangers may arise from foreseeable and unforeseeable

causes. You fully understand and acknowledge that the aforementioned risks, dangers and hazards are potential elements in connection with your travel and recreational activities which may take place during your journey.

22. EXPRESS ASSUMPTION OF RISK & **RESPONSIBILITY/PARTICIPATION**

In recognition of the inherent risk of the travels and related activities in which you are intending to engage, you confirm that you are physically and mentally capable of participating in the activity, that you are willingly and knowingly electing to participate in this tour in spite of the potential risk of danger, and you willingly and voluntarily assume full responsibility for any injury, loss or damage suffered by you or caused by you, including emotional injury or injury to person or property, whether caused in whole or in part by the negligence, fault or wrongdoing, whether expected or not, of the owners, directors, agents, officers, employees, contractors, or subcontractors of QEI or of other participants. You understand and acknowledge that due to the remoteness of where we travel, emergency evacuation and/or search and rescue may be delayed or unavailable and that medical facilities and supplies may be limited and you acknowledge that it is your responsibility to assess the impact such limitations may have on any existing medical condition(s). You understand and acknowledge that QEI reserves the right to accept or reject any participant for any reason, and QEI or its guide has the right to disqualify you from any trip activity, if in QEI's or such guide's judgment, you are incapable of that activity and/or your continued participation in the tour will endanger yourself or the safety of the group. It is your responsibility and obligation to inform QEI, at the time your reservation is made, of any medical or physical disability or limitation that might disable you or render you unable to perform or safely complete the tour or any activity on the tour. You further acknowledge that you are the best judge of your own conditions and limitations and that it is incumbent upon you to fully disclose the full extent of any such conditions or limitations to QEI. The traveler is hereby expressly advised that the vessel/camp may be powered or operated in whole or in part by nuclear power or a similar power and the traveler hereby accepts all risks, whether known or unknown, inherent therein and agrees that neither Quark nor the vessel/camp owner shall have any liability for injury, illness or death resulting therefrom.

23. RELEASE OF LIABILITY

In consideration of the services and arrangements provided by QEI, you, for yourself and for your heirs, personal representatives or assigns, do hereby release, waive, discharge, hold harmless and agree to indemnify QEI, and its owners, officers, directors, employees, contractors, subcontractors and affiliates from any and all claims, actions, or losses for emotional injury, bodily injury, property damage, wrongful death, loss of services, lost profits, consequential, exemplary, indirect or punitive damages or otherwise which may

arise out of or occur during your travel in connection with the scheduled travel package and any activities conducted in conjunction therewith and shall include, without limitation, any loss caused by breakage of shafts or any defect or unseaworthiness in hull, machinery or appurtenances, equipment, furnishings, supplies or officers or crew of the vessel/camp or its launches or watercraft; fault or neglect of the master, tugs, officers or members of the crew, agents, servants, independent contractors; the quality, nature or consequences of medical or surgical treatment; any loss, damage or delay arising from inherent defect, or vice or quality of the traveler's baggage or from the insufficiency, inadequacy of absence of baggage marks or of address or description of such baggage; any loss or damage caused by delay in, or prevention of sailing, prolongation of the expedition, deviation or stoppage in transit, or from any calls at ports or variations from the scheduled or regular course of the expedition; seizure of the vessel/camp under legal process; any act, omission, fault or negligence of the traveler or fellow travelers. No suits shall be maintainable against Quark or the vessel/camp owner upon any claim in connection with the provision of the travel packages relating to baggage or any other property unless written notice of the claim, with full particulars, shall be delivered to Quark within twenty-four (24) hours after termination of the expedition. In no event shall any suit for any cause against Quark or the vessel/camp owner with respect to baggage or other property be maintainable unless such suit shall be commenced within six (6) months after disembarkation from the vessel/camp.

24. EXPRESS WAIVER OF CONSEQUENTIAL, PUNITIVE OR EXEMPLARY DAMAGES

Regardless of the situation or circumstances giving rise to a claim, you waive any right to seek consequential, punitive or exemplary damages against QEI its owners, officers, directors, agents, contractors and employees, for any reason whatsoever.

25. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY, PERSONAL INJURY

QEI and carrier hereby disclaims all liability to the passengers for emotional distress, mental suffering, psychological injury of any kind under any circumstances, when such damages were neither the result of physical injury, nor were intentionally inflicted by QEI or carrier. Without limiting the preceding sentence, in no event will QEI or carrier be liable to the passenger for any consequential, incidental, exemplary or punitive damages.

26. ARBITRATION

Any controversy or claim arising out of or relating to these Terms and Conditions or the performance there under, including without limitation any claim related to bodily injury, property damage or death, shall be settled by binding arbitration in Atlanta, GA, USA, in accordance with the rules of the American Arbitration Association then existing, and judgment on the arbitration award may be entered in any court having jurisdiction over the subject matter of the controversy. This agreement to arbitrate does not waive or modify the liability release contained in this document. Such proceedings will be governed by substantive Delaware law. The dispute will be resolved by a single arbitrator who must be a lawyer admitted to practice in the courts of at least one state in the United States and have a minimum of 15 years of experience in civil litigation. The arbitrator so described will be selected by the American Arbitration Association. Each party to the dispute shall have the right on a single occasion to veto the designation of an arbitrator so selected. The parties waive the right to rely on any state law or statute which creates an exception to enforcement of the requirement that disputes be resolved pursuant to arbitration in the manner set forth herein.

27. EXCLUSIVE GOVERNING LAW & IURISDICTION

These Terms and Conditions and any actions and proceeding brought hereunder shall be governed by the laws of the State of Delaware without regard to conflict of laws principles. If the right to seek arbitration is for any reason waived by both parties, or if judicial review of any arbitration decision is sought, any action or legal proceeding to enforce any provision hereof, or based on any right arising out of, these Terms and Conditions shall be exclusively in the courts of the State of Delaware, or if it has or can acquire jurisdiction, in the United States District Court for the District of Delaware, and all of the parties hereto hereby consent to the exclusive jurisdiction of such courts and of the appropriate appellate courts in any such action or legal proceeding and waive any objection to venue or jurisdiction in connection therewith.

28. WAIVER OF JURY TRIAL

In connection with any action or legal proceeding arising out of these Terms and Conditions, the parties hereby specifically and knowingly waive any rights that either party might have to demand a jury trial.

29. CLASS ACTION WAIVER

These Terms and Conditions provide for the exclusive resolution of disputes through individual legal action on the traveler's own behalf instead of through any class action. Even if the applicable law provides otherwise, the traveler agrees that any legal action against Quark whatsoever shall be litigated by the traveler individually and not as a member of any class or as part of a class action, and the traveler expressly agrees to waive any law entitling guests to participate in a class action.

30. TIME LIMIT FOR CLAIMS

Quark shall not be liable for claims, actions, or losses for bodily injury, emotional injury or distress, property damage, wrongful death, loss of services, lost profits, consequential, exemplary, indirect or punitive damages or otherwise which may arise out of or occur during your travel in connection with the scheduled travel package and any activities conducted in conjunction therewith, unless full details in writing are given to Quark within 185 days after the date of the event giving rise to such claim. Suit to recover on any such claim shall not be maintainable unless filed within one (1) year after the date of the event giving rise to such claim and unless served on Ouark within 120 days after filing. You expressly waive all other potentially applicable state or federal limitation periods.

31. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of these Terms and Conditions shall be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions shall not in any way be affected or impaired thereby.

32. TRAVEL AGENT

The passenger acknowledges and confirms that any travel agent utilized by the passenger in connection with the issuance of this ticket contract is, for all purposes, the passenger's agent and Quark shall not be liable for any representation made by said travel agent. The passenger shall remain liable at all times to Quark for the price of passage. The passenger understands and agrees that receipt of this ticket contract or any other information or notices by the passenger's travel agent shall be deemed receipt by the passenger as of the date of receipt by the agent. The passenger acknowledges that Quark is not responsible for the financial condition or integrity of any travel agent.

33. USE OF LIKENESS

Travelers extend Quark permission to film or take their photograph during the voyage, release all rights over those images and videos, and understand and consent that QEI may use any likeness taken of you and any of your comments while on your tour for future publicity and promotional material. Travelers who do not wish to be photographed or filmed during the voyage must inform Quark in writing prior to the voyage.

34. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

These Terms and Conditions shall represent the entire agreement between the parties on the subject matter hereof and any and all prior agreements, discussions, representations, whether oral or in writing, are hereby superseded by the terms herein.






